



London's Electric Dreams? MAG brings them back to earth.

It's often said that what happens in America will happen here ten years later. But it's also true that what happens in London often sets a precedent for the rest of the country. It was therefore vital that, as London's mayor Sadiq Khan publishes his draft Transport Strategy, MAG makes sure that biker's interests are The headline proposal in the represented. strategy is for a "zero emission zone" where "traditionally powered vehicles (i.e. anything other than electric) will be charged £24 a day to enter. This would come into force by 2025, expanded to all of inner London by 2040 and throughout the whole capital by 2050. London is now moving towards a future free of fossil fuels - all new taxis



will have to be electric or hybrid by 2020, with the rest converting by 2033. In such a climate the chances of petrol motorcycles gaining exemption seem remote at most. More ominously, the strategy also outlines a "vision zero" approach to road safety in order to "eliminate all deaths and serious injuries from road collisions by 2041". This could potentially pose the most serious threat to biking, as it is impossible to produce a 100% safe bike (not one that you'd want to ride anyway). Luckily MAG's Leon Manning was there to have an input into the drafting of the strategy, and make sure that the benefits of powered two-wheelers were recognised. The strategy now states that "two-wheeled vehicles could, however, play a more significant role in low-impact freight and servicing trips, especially where these ... are made by ultra-low emission motorcycle". The strategy also outlines plans to make biking safer in the city:

- "a) Improving the safety of street design by following the guidance set out in TfL's Urban Motorcycle Design Handbook.
- b) Improving the quality of motorcycle safety training by delivering a 'London Standard' for motorcycle training that goes beyond the minimum required by law. The 'London Standard' of motorcycle training will involve:
- improving the standard of motorcycle training in London by encouraging training providers to become accredited through the Motorcycle Industry Association (MCIA)
- improving rider skills (particularly those of young riders) by promoting a suite of voluntary training courses including BikeSafe-London, ScooterSafe-London, 121 Motorcycle Skills and through the introduction of a pre-Compulsory Basic Training theory app
- raising the safety standards of motorcycle courier businesses through training and accreditation c) Calling on all boroughs to allow motorcycle access to their bus lanes, to end the inconsistency
- between highway authorities that causes unnecessary confusion and risk to motorcyclists.
 d) Educating other road users on the shared responsibility for safer motorcycle journeys, through the promotion of driver and cyclist skills training and communications.
- e) Supporting the police in targeting illegal and non-compliant behaviour that puts motorcyclists at risk, using data to focus on the streets with a higher risk of motorcyclist collisions" This all seems to continue the trend away from petrol/diesel vehicles towards "renewables". It could have been a lot worse and without MAG being there you suspect it would have been. However, it still looks like the days of riding your petrol bike freely into Britain's cities are numbered.



Farmyard Heatwave Shock

There have been damp years and muddy years but rarely have there been so many hungover bikers out of their tents so early in the morning just to escape the heat. Brum Demo and Bike Security Event – 1st July

The annual Brum Demo takes place on 1st July day, setting off from The Old Hare & Hounds, Lickey Road, Rednal, B45 8UU at 1.00 pm (meet from midday) with its finish point in Cannon Hill Park, to mark the start of a MAG organised Motorcycle Security Event. MAG's West Midlands region is hosting the event in a bid to help bikers protect their machines from the everpresent threat of bike theft, which is



reaching epidemic proportions in many of the country's major cities.

Colin Brown, MAG's Political Officer for the region, stated "Bike theft continues to rise, not just locally, but nationally: it is widely recognised that bike theft has become a very big issue, with many bikes and scooters being stolen for use in other crimes. The problem is widespread, especially in our cities".

With police forces overstretched and battling limited resources, MAG is working hard to play its part in reducing the problem. Colin added "we are working with Crime Prevention Officers and the Assistant PCC, as well as lobbying councils for improved secure parking facilities".

The Security event will take place at **Cannon Hill Park**, on **Saturday 1st July 2017**, starting at **2.00** pm and finishing around 5.00 pm. Arrangements have been made for provision of discounts on marking kits, and alarm and tracker fitting, plus security-related raffle prizes and information stands such as Sold Secure.
