The Future is Smart

So, seven more stretches of "Smart" motorways get the green light from the government just as the head of Highways England stands down from his £450,000 p.a. job over criticism of the policy. Jim O'Sullivan has refused to admit that there are any serious problems with the system, first introduced 14 years ago. Despite widespread public concerns over safety, Mr. O'Sullivan insisted that they are safer than conventional motorways. The new stretches are likely to be on the M6, M62, M56, A1(M), M1, M25 and the M40/M42 interchange.

Regardless of the advantages or disadvantages, we still have the pleasure of putting up with their construction. Just this week I slogged through



20 miles of upgrade roadworks between junctions 13 and 15 on the M6. About half way though the speed limit now increases to 60mph, which would be great if it hadn't resulted in a traffic jam straight away (of course the narrowed lanes prevented any filtering). As usual, there were bits of sporadic work going on but long stretches with absolutely no activity visible. I've long wondered why they can't just work on a one mile stretch and then move on when it's finished, leaving travellers much less inconvenienced. I'm sure there will be a good reason why they don't do this but I've yet to hear it.

New powers for councils to fine road users have resulted in a 34% increase in the number of such fines being issued. Since London and Cardiff councils have been allowed to issue fines directly they have collected more than £58 million, mainly from vehicles stopping in yellow boxes. Concerns are now being raised that this is turning into a "cash cow" for hard-up boroughs. In other areas it is the responsibility of the police to issue such fines. As the government plans to grant such powers to all council, alarm bells are ringing with road users organisations that once again road users will be seen as easy marks.

Highway Code adapts to Driverless Technology

As of next spring the DfT plans to legalise the use of "lane keeping" technology on motorways in the UK. For the first time, drivers will be allowed to take their hands off the wheel and rely on the car to keep between the lines. This will meaning changing Rule 150 of the Highway Code that states that drivers should keep their hands on the wheel at all times. No cars are presently sold with this ability although many have "lane assist", which alerts the driver if they drift out of their lane.

Overall this could be a good thing. With the massive increase in texting-while-driving over the past few years, anything that stops cars wandering into the side of me on the motorway is very welcome.
